Civil


Jeremy's civil liberties experience includes: (i) defending the first criminal prosecution of the new offences (re animal research organizations) under s 145/6 Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005 at the Old Bailey; (ii) defending the second proceedings charging the same offences (a Very High Cost Case at Birmingham CC- contract manager agreed exemption from local counsel rules due to expertise); and (iii) various proceedings relating to the activities of activists around the country; civil actions against the police and defending High Court actions and Committal applications brought by claimants including Monsanto, Huntingdon Life Sciences, John Lewis and Circus King.

In Immigration and Asylum, Jeremy has represented at all levels from the FTT through to the Court of Appeal, including the Administrative Court. He has a wide knowledge of this area of law although his criminal and civil liberties
