Mary Bosworth is the Director of the Centre for Criminology and Fellow of St Cross College at the University of Oxford and, concurrently, Professor of Criminology at Monash University in Australia. In Oxford, Mary directs Border Criminologies, an interdisciplinary research group focusing on the intersections between criminal justice and border control. Prof. Bosworth has published widely on immigration detention in a number of countries, including the UK, Greece, France, Hungary and Italy. She contributed to both of the Shaw Reviews into vulnerable people in detention and is a member of the Shaw Analytical Advisory Panel, which has been set up by the Home Office to evaluate the response to these reviews. She is currently conducting research into in-country detainee transportation and deportation. Prof. Bosworth 's research has been funded by the European Research Council, the Leverhulme Trust, the British Academy, the ESRC, the Nuffield Foundation, the Open Society Foundations, and the John Fell Fund. Mary is the UK Editor-in-Chief of *Theoretical Criminology*, a co-editor of *Routledge Studies in Criminal Justice, Borders and Citizenship*, and a member of the editorial boards of *Race & Justice*, the *International Journal of Migration and Border Studies* and *Clarendon Studies in Criminology*.
